MAYOR BLANGIARDI DELIVERS 2024 STATE OF THE CITY ADDRESS

On March 14, I attended Mayor Blangiardi's 2024 State of the City Address with my fellow Councilmembers. The Mayor highlighted his administration's dedication to fostering affordable housing by proposing the establishment of a new Department of Housing and Land Management, while also outlining advancements in improving the Department of Planning and Permitting's performance through the implementation of a modern permitting system. Additionally, he unveiled plans for roving park crews to



enhance maintenance and services in City parks along the Wai'anae Coast, 'Ewa Beach, and other Central O'ahu communities. We are excited to work with the Mayor in making Honolulu a thriving city.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO: PRACTICING SAFE BICYCLING!

- DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SERVICES -

Practice safe bicycling by using hand signals! Most drivers and other bicyclists are unaware where bicyclists plan to go unless they let them know by use of hand signals while riding. Use of hand signals about 100 feet before the turn, like turn signals on cars, help others anticipate a bicyclist's intended movements and reduce the chance of collisions.

Left Turn: Left hand and arm extended horizontally beyond the side of the bicycle.



Right Turn: Right hand and arm extended horizontally to the righthand side of the downward beyond bicycle **OR** left arm extended upward and hand raised, as shown above.



Decrease in Speed: Left hand and arm extended the side of the bicycle.

KING KAMEHAMEHA III LEI DRAPING CEREMONY - THOMAS SQUARE PARK -

On Monday, March 18, the Honolulu City Council honored King Kamehameha III at a special lei draping ceremony for his birthday. The Honolulu Fire Department was established in December of 1850 by King Kamehameha III.

After 50 years at their Mōʻiliʻili location, and a move to Pālolo Valley in the Hapa Market and Grill, the Kokua Market Co-op announced they will be sunsetting their operations. Kokua Market was the first natural foods cooperative in Hawaii, and supported Hawaii's agricultural industry by carrying fresh 100% local produce since 1971.

The DFM's Storm Water Quality Division is continuing to monitor the water quality of the Pukele and Waiomao tributaries as part of efforts to maintain a resilient Pālolo Subwatershed. Additionally, Hawai'i Green Growth and partners will conduct free rainwater assessments throughout the community to



identify and size green stormwater solutions for residential, commercial, and public properties.
