



While the second Monday in October is observed throughout the United States as Indigenous People's Day (& federally as Christopher Columbus Day), this day is known throughout Hawai'i as Discoverers' Day in recognition of the Polynesian discoverers of the Hawaiian Islands.

Polynesians settled in Hawai'i between 300 AD – 600 AD, a thousand years before Captain Cook's arrival. They navigated thousands of miles in outrigger or double-hulled voyaging canoes for weeks at a time, using only their knowledge of the stars to guide them. The ancient Polynesians are regarded as the supreme navigators of oceanic travel, & their accomplishments are observed with the utmost admiration.

Today, the Polynesian Voyaging Society honors & perpetuates traditional Polynesian voyaging through educational programs that inspire respect for communities, culture, & environment.

The O'ahu Babe Ruth League Hawaiian Islanders emerged as the champions of the 2023 13-&-Under Babe Ruth World Series Championship, showcasing their remarkable teamwork, sportsmanship, & dedication. LEGISLATIVE REVIEW



During September, the Honolulu City Council met in Committee Meetings to discuss important bills & resolutions affecting City & County of Honolulu residents & addressing issues that impact the community's wellbeing.

- <u>Bill 52 (2023) Relating to Large Dwellings</u>: Aims to enhance penalties for developing oversized homes, known as monster homes. This bill proposes substantial fines of up to \$25,000 for initial violations & daily penalties of \$10,000 per violation. The goal is to discourage the construction of oversized homes that may disrupt the character & harmony of Honolulu's neighborhoods. Bill 52 passed its first reading at the Zoning Committee Meeting on September 6.
- Resolution 23-209: Urging the Department of Human Resources to work with the University of Hawai'i Community College System to create a General Civics Program at the Community Colleges on O'ahu.
- **Resolution 23-212:** Requesting the Department of Transportation Services to conduct a Traffic Study on the Wai'alae Avenue corridor between 1st Avenue & 11th Avenue, including cross streets.
- **Resolution 23-214**: Federal Highway Administration & Federal Transit Administration Candidate Project for consideration in the New Federal Fiscal Years 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program.

City Announces Junior Lifeguard Programs for Fall Break



Attention parents of keiki ages 11-17. The Honolulu Emergency Services Department, Ocean Safety & Lifeguard Services Division is proud to announce the return of the Fall 2023 Ocean Safety Junior Lifeguard Program! This FREE one-day program will be held at five locations around O`ahu from Oct. 9-13. Register your keiki at emergencyservices.honolulu.gov/ocean-safety-lifeguard-services/junior-lifeguards. Keiki may only participate in one of the day-long programs, & preference will be given to those from zip codes nearest each location!


Keiki who complete the program, will receive a Fall Junior Lifeguards Certificate. The one-day program will run from 9 am to 3 pm & include instruction in CPR, Basic First Aid, Rescue Board, Rescue Tube, & Near-shore rescue techniques.

- Hūnānaniho (formerly Waimānalo Bay Beach Park), Waimānalo (Tuesday, Oct. 10)

- Kaimana Beach, Waikīkī (Thursday, Oct. 12)
- Kailua Beach Park, Kailua (Friday, Oct. 13)
