LEGISLATIVE REVIEW

For this legislative update there are a few bills of note.

Bill 59 seeks to provide a real property tax incentives for the dedication of real property towards an eligible film studio facility. The cost of construction and investment needs to be at least \$100,000,000 and a minimum of 10 acres. The hope is that the film studio facilities constructed as a result of this bill will contribute to both the growth and the health of the film industry as well as a boost to the investment in the City.

Bill 52 provides a more effective deterrent to developers, applicants, plan makers, architects, and/or engineer supplying incorrect information on plans that violate the monster homes ordinance. The Bill has an initial fine of up to \$25,000, plus up to \$10,000, per day per violation.

Bill 40 seeks to establish additional requirements for the Transit Construction Mitigation Fund. The purpose of the transit construction mitigation fund is to receive and expend moneys to mitigate negative economic impacts from the construction of Honolulu High-Capacity Corridor Project.


